What we provide: The University of the Arts provides the workshop facilitator, materials for each participant, a flash drive for each participant loaded with digital materials for immediate classroom use and more – all at no cost!

Workshops can be delivered in three-hour or five-hour sessions – or can be slightly customized to meet your departmental needs. Teachers in all workshops work together in small groups and pairs to model learning activities using primary sources.

Three-Hour Teaching with Primary Sources Workshops for K-12 Educators: This workshop provides an introduction for K-12 educators to the digital archives of the Library of Congress. Learn how to navigate and access primary source items from the Library of Congress and discuss ways to lead students through inquiry-based learning strategies in the classroom.

Five-Hour Teaching with Primary Sources Workshops for K-12 Educators: In this longer, one-day workshop, K-12 educators better understand, identify and use the digital archives of the Library of Congress in their classrooms. More time is allocated to have teachers identify sources relating to their content areas, practice using various analysis tools and more. Lunch is also provided!
