What is a TPS Level III Coach?

The TPS-UArts Level III Coaches program is part of the national TPS consortium, funded by the Library of Congress. As a TPS Level III Teacher Coach, you can advocate the use of primary sources and help disseminate the ideas, methods and products of the TPS program to your local school and educational community networks.

As Coachess, you learn:

- How to apply knowledge of TPS materials and methods gained from Level I and Level II curriculum.
- How to adapt and deliver TPS professional development and/or create effective coaching to meet the needs of adult learners.
- To provide fellow teachers the knowledge, skills and aspirations to use TPS content in classrooms.
- A variety of coaching techniques to support teachers in the use of Library of Congress primary sources and TPS strategies.

- Training involves both in-person workshops held at the University of the Arts and online self-directed content. Participants should be comfortable with internet searching, uploads, and other basic computing skills to participate.

- Submit an official transcript(s) from universities attended where the highest level degree was earned.
- Submit a one-page statement regarding your experiences with the Teaching with Primary Sources Program at the University of the Arts and your interest in becoming a Coach

What is required for me to complete the training program to become an Coach?

All training activities and workshops are completely free, with materials and parking provided.

OVERVIEW:

- Friday February 20: Priority Application Deadline
- Monday February 23: Decisions/Acceptances sent to applicants

COURSE CONTENT:

- Participants complete six hours of online independent training modules through the Library of Congress and read preparatory article.
- Saturday March 14: 10 am 3 pm: One-day workshop training at the University of the Arts, led by Librarian Stormy Vogel. Hands-on practice with LOC professional development modules demonstrating effective instructional uses of primary sources
- Online Class: Tuesdays, March 17 April 21, 2015, 5:30 6:30 pm: Complete a six-week synchronous online
 Coaches Academy training course, provided through the TPS consortium partner Waynesburg University.
- Saturday April 25: 10 am 3 pm: One-day workshop training at the University of the Arts, led by Librarian
 Expert Stormy Vogel: share professional development plan and work with TPS network.
- Saturday May 16: 10 am 3 pm: Observe at the one-day TPS Level I workshop day at UArts campus.
- Course ends and participants earn their 3.0 graduate credits over the spring term.

COACH TRAINING:

- Summer 2015: Optional opportunities to assist at a TPS-UArts summer course stipends will be issued to participants who assist at these course sessions.
- Fall 2015: Deliver a TPS training to teachers in your educational community; submit a blog article about your experiences with TPS.
- Upon delivery of a training and blog article, Coaches receive an iPAD mini!
